FANTASY FEST

nother Halloween has come and gone and another edition of the Fantasy Fest poster either hangs limply in storefront windows or discarded along the infrequently cleaned streets. Every year at Halloween Key West pulls out all the stops and celebrates in a way that attracts national attention. Fantasy Fest, for those uneducated in the ways of Key West, is week long adult Halloween party. Costumes are optional, bizarre behavior is not only condoned, but required, and all scruples are checked at the door. Comparisons to Mardi Gras have been made by those engaging in this activity, and those who choose not to participate have likened it to a week in a mental institution. To the uninitiated it may secm a rather unorthodox way to celebrate the "hallowed" eve of All Saints' Day, but to the thousands that witness the grand parade (the grand parade down Duval Street climaxes the week long celebration) it seems most appropriate.

Jimmy Buffett and all the Margaritians had great seats this year; on the roof of the new store location at 500 Duval. The judges booth sat directly opposite the store and opinions regarding the

floats in the parade flew from both sides of the street, the judges being much more forgiving than the more critical "unofficial judges" across the street. One float, however, that merited the attention of all was the 'MARG-ARITAVILLE FLOAT. MARC; the Monroe Association for Retarded Citizens, through the sponsorship of Margaritaville

(hence Marc-aritaville) held the "clean up" position in the parade providing debris removal both during and after the parade. Borrowing from the visit of the now infamous Garbage Barge from Islip, NY to Key West waters, MARC chose that memorable event as a worthy theme; underlying the legitimate concern of all Keys residents.

Fantasy Fest is an annual event held during the last week in October. Hotel rooms are usually difficult to obtain as are bar stools, so early reservations and timely planning is recommended.


of The Margaritaville Cafe Jimmy is now being featured in magazines such as Restaurant & Institutions.






